About Kids Brain Health Foundation

Every child deserves the chance to thrive. At Kids Brain Health Foundation (KBHF), we work to ensure that children with neurodevelopmental disabilities (NDDs) - such as autism, cerebral palsy, and fetal alcohol spectrum disorder - and their families can access the tools, programs, and support they need to reach their full potential.

Approximately 10% of children and youth in Canada live with an NDD, accounting for nearly 75% of all childhood disability cases. These children and their families often face immense challenges: delayed diagnoses, limited access to effective therapies, and a lack of coordinated support. While research continues to advance our understanding of how to better support these children, these scientific discoveries often fail to reach those who need them, and too many families are still left waiting for help.

Kids Brain Health Foundation exists to change that.



Established in 2016, KBHF is the charitable arm of the Kids Brain Health Network (KBHN)—Canada's first national research network focused on neurodevelopment. Together, we work to translate cutting-edge discoveries into real-world solutions that directly benefit children and families.

By partnering with communities, service providers, researchers, industry, and government, KBHF supports the scale and spread of proven, evidence-based programs, making life-changing interventions accessible in homes, schools, and communities nationwide.

Since its inception, KBHF and KBHN have invested over \$100 million in national initiatives that advance early diagnosis, expand access to effective therapies, and strengthen family supports.

Moving forward, the newly established Kids Brain Health Innovation Fund (KBH-IF) promises to further amplify our ability to leverage and accelerate the growth, scale, and spread of programs and innovations, increasing access for children and families to supports and programs that improve lives and deliver on our vision and mission.

KBH+ represents the full Kids Brain Health enterprise—an integrated ecosystem made up of Kids Brain Health Network (KBHN), Kids Brain Health Foundation (KBHF), and Kids Brain Health Innovation Fund (KBH-IF). Together, these three entities drive discovery, mobilize funding, and scale proven solutions to improve the lives of children with neurodevelopmental disabilities and their families across Canada.



Vision and Mission

VISION

All Children living with neurodevelopmental disabilities enjoy a good quality of life and inclusion in all aspects of society and reach their full potential.

MISSION

Through catalyzing collective action across sectors, KBH+ ensures optimal care and better outcomes for children with neurodevelopmental disabilities and their families.

Kids Brain Health (KBH+) focuses on proven solutions in three key areas:

01 Early identification

Identifying neurodevelopmental disabilities early leads to timely interventions. Too often, children are not identified during the critical early periods of brain development when interventions have the most significant impact on the trajectory of their disabilities. Kids Brain Health (KBH+) supports initiatives that advance diagnosis into infancy, allowing early identification of neurodevelopmental disabilities in children.

02 Effective interventions

Early interventions have the greatest impact on children with neurodevelopmental disabilities. Kids Brain Health (KBH+) works at the cutting edge of brain health to ensure all children and families can access effective interventions.

03 Family support

Families raising children with neurodevelopmental disabilities face challenges that affect most aspects of their lives. Kids Brain Health (KBH+) collaborates with experts with lived experience to advance strategies and projects that enhance family support, reduce family stress, improve communication, and increase access to resources that help children reach their full potential.

We are **seeking up to seven new board members** for KBHF. All new board members should have an extensive network they are willing to tap into to solicit support for the Foundation, and as a group, a combination of the following key skills and experience.

1. Nonprofit & Charitable Governance

- Board governance experience (nonprofit or public sector)
- Familiarity with CRA compliance, fiduciary duties, and bylaws
- Strategic planning and performance monitoring

2. Finance, Accounting & Investment

- CPA or equivalent designation
- Budgeting, financial oversight, and audit experience
- Endowment and investment strategy (especially for sustaining funds like a foundation)

3. Fundraising & Philanthropy

- Major gifts, donor relations, or corporate sponsorship
- Grant writing/awarding, or foundation partnerships
- Experience with donor stewardship and prospect strategy

4. Legal, Risk & Compliance

- Background in charity law, privacy (e.g., PIPEDA), or intellectual property
- Experience in risk management or contract (grant) oversight





5. Health, Medicine or Clinical Research

- Pediatric neurology, developmental pediatrics, or child psychology
- Health systems research, public health, or implementation science
- Academic research expertise in neurodevelopmental disabilities (NDDs)

6. Lived/living Experience and Community Advocacy

- Family caregiver of a child with an NDD
- Advocate or leader in the NDD community

7. Communications, Media & Public Engagement

- Branding, PR, journalism, or digital engagement
- Public speaking or media training, especially for advocacy or crisis communication

Other considerations:

- Geographic location (national representation)
- French: bilingualism
- Indigenous/ethnic representation
